Item. I give to the poore of Twyford five shillings.

Item. I give to my god sonne Thomas Holton five shillings.

Item. I give to my god sonne Francis Kelly five shillings.

Item. I give to my god daughter Elizbeth Mores five shillings.

Item. I give to Thomas Kelly five shillings.

Lastly my debts which I owe either of right or conscience yet my funeral expences discharge the residue of all my worldly goods I give and bequeath to Margery my wife whom I make my executrix. I make Thomas Williams and my brother Hue Chilton overseers to see this my last will performed.
